

MRC Pre-Employment Transition Services

Service Delivery Model for the 2018 to 2019 School Year

What is new?

- ◆ Pre-employment transition services now start at age 14 for students with disabilities in high school and are available until they graduate or turn 22
- ◆ MRC is now serving high school/post-secondary students who do not necessarily need to apply for Vocational Rehabilitation services but could benefit from exposure to employment and career development supports

What is the same?

- ◆ Students with disabilities who may benefit from Vocational Rehabilitation services can still work directly with your MRC liaison (for students two years from graduation who need more individualized support)

What are the goals of pre-employment transition services?

- ◆ Services emphasis awareness, exploration, and preparation
- ◆ Students can receive one or more of the five pre-employment transition services
- ◆ The goal is to provide students with the skills needed to be successful with employment or further education after high school

How to connect to services and supports?

- ◆ Students with disabilities can connect directly through a community provider
- ◆ Ask your MRC liaison what providers are in your community
